Village Erects Sound Barrier Along Veterans Memorial Highway as Part of Beautification Program

On December 13, 2010, Mayor Allan M. Dorman was joined by members of the village board and staff to review the completion of a 1,500-foot-long fence that was constructed alongside Veterans Memorial Highway. This project was two years in the making and is part of the Village Beautification Plan.

The purpose of the fence is to act as a sound barrier and provide privacy for over 1,000 of the village's residents. With no state or county funds available, the village paid for the project itself. The total cost was just under \$200,000 and demonstrates the flexibility of local government to react in order to address a growing quality-of-life issue.

Patricia Peters, Alan Wolinsky and Barbara Lacey Win Village Elections

The Village of Islandia announced on March 15 that Trustees Patricia Peters and Barbara Lacey and Justice Alan Wolinsky won their respective races in the village elections. The elections were uncontested.

The term for a Village Trustee is four years. Ms. Peters has been a Village Trustee since 2007. In 2010, Ms. Lacey was appointed to the Village Trustee post that was vacated by Suellen Leonardo.

The term for a Village Justice is four years. Mr. Wolinsky has served at that post for 20 years.

A swearing-in ceremony for Ms. Lacey and Ms. Peters was held on April 5 at village hall.
