DWI Program in Islandia - a Big Success

On May 9, the Village of Islandia held its fourth annual Community Garden Planting and DWI Awareness Program on the village hall grounds. Village residents, board members and employees planted flowers and vegetables in the community garden. The young plants were graciously provided by Borella Nursery. Now, local residents can visit the garden, help take care of the plants and enjoy watching the fruits of their labor grow.

The garden was opened in 2006 as the result of an initiative put forth by Village Mayor Allan Dorman. Mayor Dorman and the village residents are hoping for a bumper crop this year. Residents who participated in the planting not only help beautify the village, but will get a chance to work alongside their neighbors and enjoy each other's company.

"We are teaching our children the beauty of community involvement and the wonders of growing flowers and vegetables with their own hands," said Village Mayor Allan Dorman. "We also would like the parents to get

involved. Everyone is invited back to the garden to nurture the plants and enjoy the fruits of their labor when they mature."

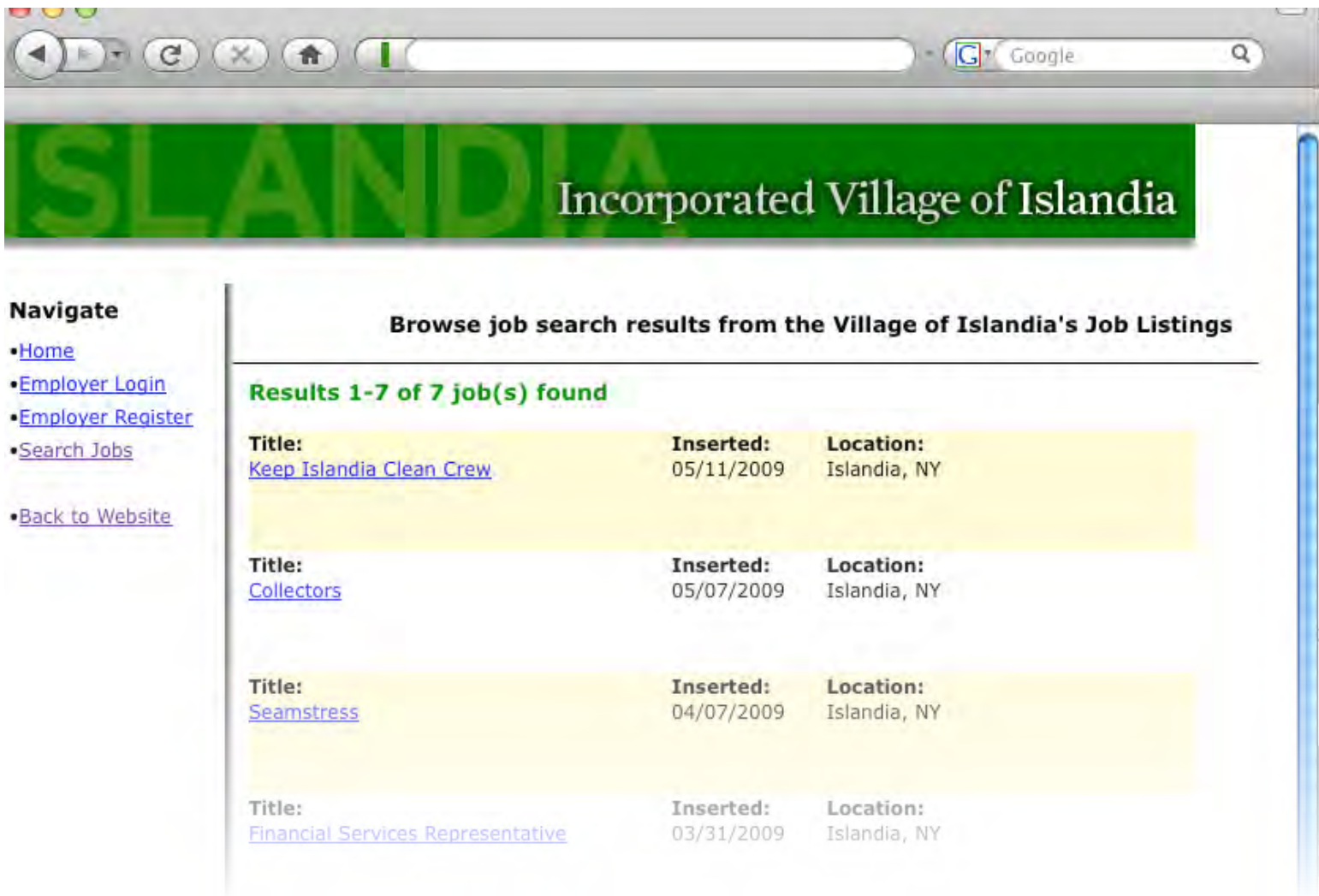
The village also brought out its "Drunk Busters" peddle

carts for its DWI Awareness Program. Village residents took part in an obstacle course in the parking lot, in which they rode peddle carts through a slalom course. After taking a ride through the course, they then put on a pair of goggles that gave the drivers the feeling of driving while intoxicated. One pair of goggles showed drivers what it was like to drive with a blood alcohol content BAC of 0.04, and another pair gave drivers the feeling of driving with a (BAC) of 0.08, which is the



legal limit in New York State.

"This has been organized as an enjoyable event, but also one that would leave an important mark on the participants," Mayor Dorman said. "This program serves as an important reminder of the dangers of driving drunk."

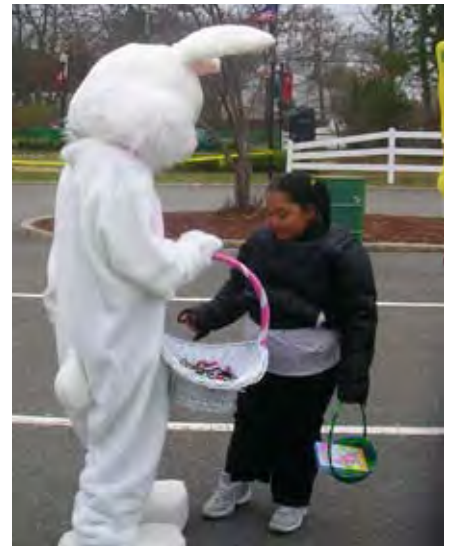

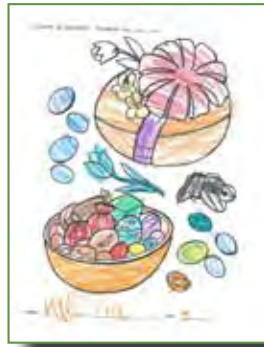

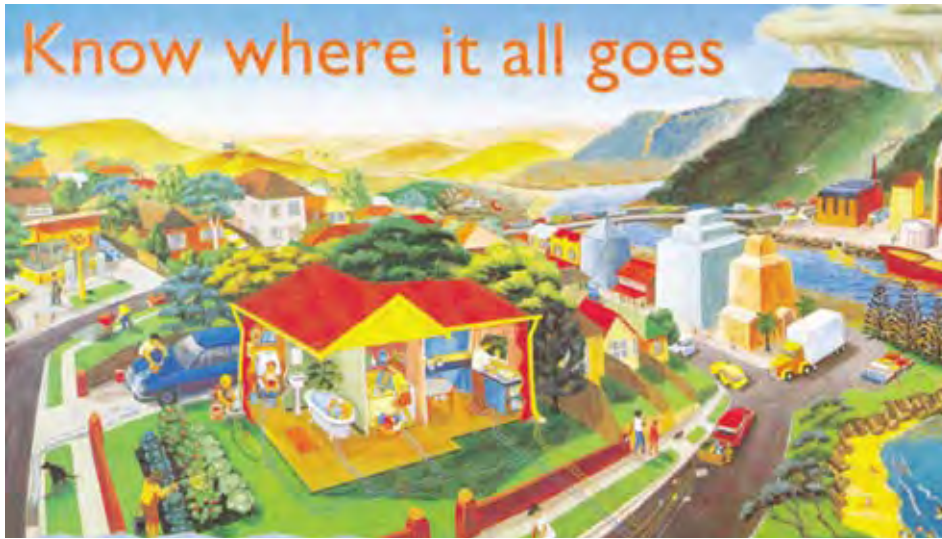

Islandia is home to the Connetquot River headwaters. The river is one of the major rivers of Long Island and carries large water flow into the Great South Bay. Stormwater runoff that enters the river from Islandia's streets and properties can carry pollutants all the way to the Great South Bay.

Clean Water Starts With Us

The Village of Islandia has announced the release of a draft version of its 2009 Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) annual report and SWMP plan, which are available for viewing at Village Hall, located at 1100 Old Nichols Road in Islandia, during normal business hours.

To meet the guidelines provided by the Department of Environmental Conservation, the village must file a report every year, detailing the steps the village has taken over the previous year to improve water quality, and which steps the village plans to take in the upcoming year.

Since 2005, Islandia Village has doubled the number of annual inspections for illicit materials in runoff. This year, the village intends to quantify all cases in which illicit materials are discovered and eliminated. The village also plans to list what constitutes illicit discharged materials on its website, www.newvillageofislandia.com, to increase public awareness. The village now requires all developments in

The Village encourages all residents to reduce the pollutants they generate by simple measures:

- » Reduce lawn area and use lawn fertilizers sparingly.
- » Never dump anything into storm drain inlets.
- » Revegetate bare soil to prevent erosion.
- » Reduce the use of toxic chemicals and dispose of chemicals properly.
- » Check vehicles for leaks and recycle motor oil.
- » Pick up after your pet.
- » Maintain your septic system and pump when necessary.
- » Pick up litter.

The SWMP plan can be viewed at village hall on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. It can also be viewed on the village website on the village's stormwater management Web page.
