Mayor Allan M. Dorman Announces Groundbreaking of Village of Islandia Commons

Site of Former Delicatessen Purchased by Village Will Provide Office and Retail Space to Generate Revenue and House Police and Safety Units to Reduce Crime and Blight

Mayor Allan M. Dorman was joined by village trustees and members of the village police and safety units in a groundbreaking ceremony on June 30 at the former site of the In & Out Deli, located on the corner of Old Nichols Road and South Bedford Avenue, to announce that the building had been purchased by the village and will be renamed Village of Islandia Commons.

In order to generate revenue, the village will lease out office and retail space to incoming businesses. The building will also house the Suffolk County police and the village's code enforcement and safety units in order to increase police presence in the area, since the building has high visibility along the main corridor. An artist's rendition of what the building will look like upon completion was made available for public viewing.

By making improvements in the area and renovating this now-shuttered building, it will also eliminate blight from the village which attracts criminal activity and drives down property values.

"Criminals should think twice before committing any crimes in Islandia," Mayor Dorman said. "This is just another step along with many that we have put into place to make our community safer for everyone."

Village Officially **Opens Its Community Garden** For 7th Season

Village residents, board members and employees got together at the village hall grounds on May 12 to take part in the village's seventh annual community garden planting. They planted tomatoes, beans, peppers, cucumbers, squash and tomatoes. Now, local residents can visit the garden, help take care of the plants and enjoy watching the fruits of their labor grow.

The garden was opened in 2006 as the result of an initiative put forth by Village Mayor Allan Dorman. Mayor Dorman and the village residents are hoping for a bumper crop this year. Residents who participate in the planting not only help beautify the village, but will get a chance to work alongside their neighbors and enjoy each other's company.



Practice BBQ Safety This Summer

Summertime is now here and many of our residents are now taking part in one of their favorite activities: barbecuing. People like to fire up their grills and throw on some steaks, chicken or fish. Barbecuing is a way for people to get out of the kitchen, spend time outdoors and enjoy the sunshine with family and friends.

However, there are some precautions you need to take before firing up the grill:

- Make sure the propane tank and Never use cigarettes, lighters or the gas hose are still in good shape. Check the tank for rust and leaks in the valve. Also, make sure the hose that runs from the tank to the grill is not leaking, bent or cracked.
- Be sure to clean off the grill before cooking. Dust and grime may have accumulated as the result of lack of use over the winter and spring seasons. If you are using a wire brush, please make sure that none of the bristles have broken off and attached themselves to the grill. If ingested, they may result in hospitalization (see photo). After scrubbing down the grill, either rinse it off or wipe it down.

When cooking, make sure the tank is upright. Move gas hoses away from dripping grease and hot surfaces.

- matches near your gas grill, whether or not it is being used. There may be a gas leak, which might trigger an explosion.
- Close the valve on the tank when vou are done. Do not remove the valve because you may risk an explosion.
- If you are using a charcoal grill, use lighter fluid only for charcoal briquettes that have not been used yet. Do not use fluid for briquettes that have already been lit.
- In the event of a fire, use a fire extinguisher or, if possible, close the lid.
- · When finished with the charcoal grill, close the lid. If you want to cool off the briquettes faster, pour cold water on them and wrap them up in heavy-duty aluminum foil. Dispose the used charcoal in a fireproof receptacle. Never throw out charcoal where there is other garbage, as this can cause a fire.
- Whether using a gas grill or charcoal grill, please keep small children and pets away to avoid serious injury.

Mayor Allan M. Dorman took part in a ribboncutting ceremony on February 29 to introduce a new handicapped-accessible bus that Rides Unlimited of Nassau & Suffolk received at its Hoffman Lane facility. Local elected officials and representatives from Rides Unlimited of Nassau & Suffolk and Arcola Bus Sales joined Mayor Dorman for the ribbon cutting.

The new bus features a hydraulic lift that allows those in wheelchairs to board the bus more easily. Rides Unlimited of Nassau & Suffolk received a donation from a family member of Robert Gallose, the New York City/Long Island sales representative of Arcola Bus Sales, and used the money to purchase the bus.

Rides Unlimited of Nassau & Suffolk is a notfor-profit 5O1c(3) corporation which provides transportation services to special-needs individuals. It has a fleet of 12O buses and serves residents in Suffolk, Nassau, Queens and Kings Counties.

Get On The Bus!

Mayor Allan M. Dorman is urging the village's senior citizens to take advantage of the village's bus service.


The handicapped-accessible bus accommodates up to 20 people and is used to transport seniors — who may otherwise have no other means of transportation — to their doctor's appointments. On certain days, transportation is provided to senior citizens who wish to do some local shopping.

In the summer of 2010, the village purchased a new bus to help senior citizens get to where they need to go. Bus service began on October 18, 2010, but only on a limited schedule. Since then, the village has expanded its service. Bus service is available by reservation only. To arrange a pickup, please call (631) 348-1133.

The ceremony also included a flyby from the U.S. Marine Corps Helicopter Squadron 361 in Cutchogue in a Sikorsky UH-34D helicopter. This type of helicopter was used for combat rescue missions during the Vietnam War, served during the Cuban Missile Crisis and was used by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) to recover astronauts from the Mercury mission.
