Summer Fun Means Safety

Summer is the season for fun, but in order for everyone to have a safe and enjoyable time, safety must be *your* top priority.

Preparing for your backyard barbeque or other summer event can often mean some form of landscaping, whether it be cutting the grass or trimming the hedges. Keep these tips in mind when working with tools powered by gasoline:

- » Store as little gasoline as is practical and never in the home.
- » Always use an approved container specifically designed to hold gasoline. Never use a glass or thin plastic jug.
- » All lawnmowers, power tools and boat engines should be turned off when fueling. Never smoke and keep openflame devices (such as grills) far away.

Once your friends arrive and you head to the grill, be sure to follow these tips:

- » All grills (charcoal or propane) should only be used outside the home.
- » Inspect the grill, gas connections and the tubing prior to use. Propane has an odor similar to sulfur. If you suspect a leak, do not light the grill.
- » When using your grill for the first time, be aware of spiders and small insects that can nest in your burner assembly. A nest will block the flow of gas and sometimes cause a flashback.


Fun Facts About Islandia Village

- » The Village has a total area of 2.2 square miles.
- » According to the 2000 United States Census,3,057 people live in the Village of Islandia.
- » There are 1,007 households and 753 families.
- » 35.3 percent had children under the age of 18 living with them and 59.8 percent had married couples living together. The average household has between 3 and 4 persons.
- » The median age is 36.
- » The median household income is \$69,519 and the median income for a family is \$69,615. Males had a median income of \$46,083 and females had a median income of \$34,261. The per capita income is \$25,682.
- » Islandia is one of four incorporated villages in the Town of Islip. The others are Brightwaters, Ocean Beach and Saltaire.

SPOTLIGHT ON: CODE INVESTIGATIONS

Helping You Follow The Code

The Village of Islandia currently has three code enforcement officers who investigate complaints and work with residents to resolve any issues they may have related to the Village Code.

The Code Investigations Division's main responsibility is for the enforcement of Village local laws and New York State laws, including, but not limited to, illegal multiple housing, quality of life concerns, property maintenance and garbage issues. Their objectives include:

- » Providing proactive enforcement of local laws, including building and zoning codes in the Village.
 - » Timely issuance of rental permits and inspections.
- » Timely response and investigation of complaints for the residents of the Village.
- » Provide efficient customer service to residents beginning home improvement projects that require Village permits.
- » Provide consistent and aggressive enforcement geared toward eliminating illegal multiple dwellings.

The investigations unit also handles parking enforcement concerning handicap and fire lane violations. The unit issues violations and appearance tickets, where appropriate.

CODE FACTS

Use your home according to its certificate of occupancy:

- » Don't allow anyone to live in your garage.
- » Don't allow anyone to live in your attic.
- >> Your home should be for single-family occupancy.
- » Multi-family dwellings are not permitted in Islandia.

One unregistered vehicle may be kept covered on your driveway. No vehicles are permitted on your lawn, front or back.

Do not perform the following work without contacting the Village to see if you need a permit:

- >> Construct a deck.
- » Finish an attic.
- >> Convert a garage into a living space.
- » Place an accessory structure on your property (garage or shed).
 - » Change or replace your heating system.
 - » Change your interior structure.

Other activities may require a permit. See the village code on the village website or contact the Code Investigations Division at 631.348.1133.
