## **School Bus Safety**

#### Did You Know?

In the last four years, 35 students were hit by motorists passing stopped school buses in New York State. Every day, nearly 50,000 motor vehicles illegally pass school buses.

Did you know you can't even pass stopped school buses in the school yard if their stop sign is out?

Please take the time to know and understand the law. Our children are the future. Keep them safe by following the rules of school bus safety.

#### The Law Says

» It is illegal — and very dangerous to pass a stopped school bus when the large red lights located on top of the bus are flashing. Flashing lights mean the bus is picking up or discharging students.

» You must stop whether you are approaching the school bus from the

#### **Cleaning the Living Area**

» A house that smells fresh will give the impression of cleanliness. Leave baking soda on carpeting for the night to absorb musty odors, then vacuum in the morning.

» Dust furniture regularly. Make sure to polish hard woods to protect their shine and finish.

» When you dust, start at the top and work down.

» To clean wood floors, put a piece of waxed paper under your dust mop. Dirt will stick to the mop and the wax will shine your floors.

» Buy floor mats for every entrance. They help reduce tracked-in dirt.

- » Vacuum or dust the draperies.
- » Wash or dry clean the blinds.

» Your fireplace should be cleaned in the spring and in the fall. Get rid of any and all debris, wash out and make sure the bricks and mantle are clean.

#### Cleaning the Kitchen

» Clean the inside and the outside of the refrigerator.



front or overtaking it from the rear.

» You must always stop for flashing red lights, even on divided and multilane highways and on school grounds.

» The first-time fine for illegally passing a school bus is a \$250 fine, 5 points on your license, and/or possibly 30 days in jail.

## **Spring Cleaning Tips**

» Wash out your cupboards and pantry, too. Dust collects there quickly.

#### **Cleaning the Bathroom**

» Grout in bathrooms should be cleaned regularly to prevent chipping, mildew and bacteria buildup.

» Lighter fluid will remove most stains from porcelain sinks and bath-tubs.

» Change the shelf liners.

#### **Cleaning the Walls**

» Wash walls from the bottom up, to avoid streaking.

» Remove crayon marks from painted walls by scrubbing with toothpaste or an ammonia-soaked cloth. Rinse and dry.

» Wash and clean the baseboards.

» Use old socks as mitts for cleaning difficult woodwork.

#### **Eliminate Clutter**

» Donate old clothes, appliances and furniture to charity.

» Worse yet, the memory of hitting or killing a child may be one you carry for the rest of your life!
